2019-20 Community Development Highlights

- Progress continued on the **Kaw Lake water pipeline** project. The project will provide a diversified, sustainable water source for Enid.
- **Vance Air Force Base increased pilot training** from 300 to 375 pilots annually.
- Enid retail sales are on pace for the **Billion by 2025 Plan**.
- **Koch Fertilizer Enid** has announced another major plant expansion will begin in 2021.
- **Wind development investment** in Garfield Co. has topped **\$1 billion** and new projects are underway.
- Enid Public Schools completed the final school improvements from the **\$93 million school bond** approved in 2016. The **competition gym** and **fine arts center** opened.
- **EPS Fowler Early Childhood Learning Center** opened on the NWOSU-Enid campus.
- **New \$2.5 million terminal** at Enid Woodring Regional Airport was completed.
- **Best Western Glo**, Enid's new downtown hotel, is under construction.
- **Enid Brewing Company** and **Settlers Brewing Company** are open in Downtown Enid.
- **New restaurants** opened in Enid's West Garriott retail corridor.
- A new movie theatre, trampoline park, restaurants and other retail development at **The District** have been announced.
- Work on **Enid Soccer Complex** continued. The facility will be a great asset for expanding athletics tourism.
- Enid is investing in **infrastructure and quality of life improvements** (water resources, road upgrades, and parks & trails).
- **Stride Bank Center** is bringing outstanding entertainment events to NW Oklahoma and helping expand Enid's visitor industry.
- **Community wayfinding signage plan** is being implemented.

2019-20 Enid Chamber Events & Activities

- Responded to **community and business needs during the pandemic**- sent PPE requests for the hospitals, provided SBA disaster loan, Payroll Protection Program and Oklahoma Business Relief Program information, offered free eblast messaging for members.
- Organized **Enid Day at the Capitol** legislative breakfast. Primary topics were health care, education and marketing Oklahoma.
- Provided the **Small Business Chamber Alliance** to Enid Chamber members. The program offers a complimentary State Chamber membership and helps businesses be engaged on legislative issues.
- Participated in **Oklahoma Mid-Size Cities Coalition** to advocate legislative priorities for mid-sized cities (rural health care, regional universities & colleges, etc.).
- Offered the **ENID 4 TEACHERS** program which provides business discounts for teachers in the region.
- Partnered with sponsors and other organizations to celebrate Enid's history and heritage through the **Cherokee Strip Celebration**.
- **Candy Cane Cash** event promoted holiday shopping in Enid and provided \$15,000 in cash prizes.
- **NW District Jr. Livestock Show** attracted over 2,500 visitors, supported youth agriculture education and raised \$162,000 for premium sale exhibitors.
- **Chamber Ambassadors** conducted ribbon cuttings for new or expanding businesses and provided volunteer support at community events.
- Provided **membership networking** opportunities through Business Spotlight @ Lunch and Business After Hours events.
- **Enid Chamber Committee of 100** contributions helped provide scholarships for area students to attend Northern Oklahoma College-Enid and Northwestern Oklahoma State University-Enid.
- Supported efforts to expand the **Coach-A-Kid Enid** mentoring program.

Economic & Community Development Strategy for the Enid Region

EDUCATION / COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT COUNCIL

Support Education and Workforce Development

- Expand mentoring programs in elementary and middle schools (support Coach a Kid program)
- Support efforts to establish a Youth Center in Enid
- Encourage businesses to provide resources for early childhood development
- Partner with local businesses to offer the ENID 4 TEACHERS discount program
- Support efforts to keep Oklahoma K-12 teacher salaries among the highest in the region (retain and attract teachers)
- Support increased funding for the classroom to help reduce class sizes
- Support efficient use of public resources for common education (encourage sensible administrative consolidation to maximize funding for the classroom)
- Protect and enhance state funding for post-secondary education (Career Tech & Higher Education)
- Encourage expanded advance placement and concurrent enrollment in our schools

LOCAL ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT / GOV'T. AFFAIRS COUNCIL

Support quality of life projects that help attract businesses, workers and families

- Support continued downtown development including the completion of the downtown hotel, improving walkability, and expanding downtown residential living
- Advocate a sustainable city budget allocation for neighborhood parks, community parks and trails system
- Support efforts for physician recruitment to ensure access to high quality healthcare for Enid and Northwest Oklahoma residents
- Promote the development of Enid Soccer Complex as a major asset for Enid's quality of life and visitor industry (Capitalize on new sports facilities to expand athletics tourism in Enid)
- Support efforts to implement the Kaw Lake pipeline project to provide a sustainable water supply for Enid
- Advocate continued implementation of the community wayfinding signage plan
- Support Enid's brand identity and help deliver Enid's "*boundless, vibrant, original*" message through Chamber events, publications, social media and website

Increase Enid's retail market share, drawing power and sales tax base (Billion By 2025 Plan)

- Highlight the importance of supporting local businesses (keep retail and tax dollars at home)
- Encourage expansion of local retailers and support the recruitment of national retailers that complement existing businesses and fill a "gap" in Enid's market (increase shopping and dining venues)
- Support the new retail development in The District (movie theatre, trampoline park, restaurants, etc.)
- Advocate the use of incentives to promote community infill and re-development
- Revitalize and/or repurpose Oakwood Mall
- Promote holiday shopping in Enid through Candy Cane Cash event
- Support efforts to increase hotel room nights in Enid (conferences, conventions & sports tournaments)

STATE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT / GOV'T. AFFAIRS COUNCIL

Promote state legislative initiatives that benefit Enid and NW Oklahoma

- Organize and promote Enid Day at the Capitol
- Support sound state funding sources for Medicaid expansion which was approved by voters in June 2020 (avoid a reduction in other core services)
- Support the thorough review of business incentives and tax credits through the Oklahoma Incentive Evaluation Commission (eliminate or phase out those that are not effective or cost efficient)
- Protect effective business incentives that have proven to attract capital investment and create new jobs
- Work with other mid-size cities to protect and enhance rural healthcare, support regional colleges and universities, and support local control for municipalities
- Promote legislation to support key sectors in Enid's regional economy (oil & gas, agriculture, medical, etc.)
- Advocate increased state funding for Enid's higher education institutions (improve access to Higher Ed)
- Utilize Oklahoma Strategic Military Planning Commission funding for projects that support VAFB
- Support building the new Greer Center facility in Enid (for dually diagnosed clients)
- Support regional highway improvements and continued funding for ODOT's 8-year plan
- Identify and promote local citizens to serve on state boards

FEDERAL ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT / GOV'T. AFFAIRS COUNCIL

Promote federal legislative initiatives that benefit Enid and NW Oklahoma

- Organize federal legislative trip to highlight community support for Vance AFB, promote mission growth opportunities for the base and support key sectors in Enid's regional economy
- Work with Vance Development Authority to support Vance (add Squadron Ops facility to DOD 5-year budget, pursue privatized dormitory project, utilize Defense Communities Infrastructure Program for Kaw Lake project)
- Protect air space for Oklahoma military installations (training routes, drop zones and runway approaches)
- Help develop new partnerships that are good for Enid, enhance Vance AFB and save military dollars
- Oppose federal regulations that place undue hardship on business and industry
- Oppose regulations or tax changes that hinder expanded oil and gas development (oppose federal regulation of hydraulic fracturing)
- Support immigration reform to secure the borders and provide a fair and efficient system for immigrants to enter or stay in the workforce
- Support legislation/regulations that help strengthen Enid's medical sector
- Support Woodring airport improvements that benefit VAFB and increase overall utilization at the airport
- Support education initiatives that benefit Enid and NW Oklahoma post-secondary education institutions
- Support congressional action to reduce the national debt
